

EXPERIENCE RIVERSDALE AT NIGHT, UNDER THE STARS, THROUGH CLOSE ENCOUNTERS AND CELESTIAL DIALOGUE

Now in its fifth year, **SITEWORKS** will become **NITEWORKS** as it turns its attention to the evening sky for an all-night celebration of the dark. Think astronomy, star gazing, campfires, moon cycles, nocturnal animals, Indigenous cosmology and UFOs.

Over the next two months we will reveal key elements of the programming to our Siteworks Associates and Bundanon e-news insiders. For this first edition we will be focusing on some of the artists commissions. As in previous years, SITEWORKS presents artists with the opportunity to create site-specific artworks- this year with the additional challenge of being created especially to be appreciated at night. There are some spectacular and interactive things planned to bring the Riversdale property to life.

Astronomy

Australia is one of the best places in the world to watch the night sky.

Lounge on the banks of the Shoalhaven River and explore the Milky Way – the galaxy we are part of – which spreads overhead like a another river, white, twinkling against an inky void. Scientists from the Anglo Australian Observatory will take you on an informed journey to space, explaining the stars and celestial objects above and answering your questions. More detailed sessions will engage with emerging galaxies, planets and phenomenon.



Star Gazing

Local nightsky specialists The Shoalhaven Astronomers will bring along their telescopes to provide opportunities to see planets and deep sky objects normally too difficult to see from our brightly lit cities.

On the 12 October we have some great star gazing conditions with the sun setting at 7.06pm and a quarter moon!

SITEWORKS brings artists, scientists and scholars to respond to the Bundanon property through the lens of their specific discipline and share their findings with the community.



Artists David Haines and Joyce Hinterding will present an experimental live set focused on "natural" VLF transmissions which allows us to listen to the sun and the background noise of the Milky Way.



University of Wollongong's Ben Gallen and Leah Gibbs will bring into conversation our everyday experiences of day and night to explore the discord or disjuncture of day-time and night-time sounds, and experiences in urban and rural spaces.



Nancy Mauro-Flude and Linda Dement offer the proposition that the light we see in the night sky connects the recent deaths of musicians Ari Up of The Slits (October 2010), Poly Styrene of X-Ray Specs (April 2011) and Chrissy Amphlett of the Divinyls (April 2013) and offers us the opportunity to 'connect' with them on the night.



Celestial Radio, a yacht covered with 60,000 mirrored tiles will sparkle from the Shoalhaven River and broadcast a soundscape by British artists Zoe Walker and Neil Bromwich.




Jacqueline Drinkall's largescale sculptural work Weatherman UFOlogy. A close encounter at Riversdale.
